This has been another busy year because although burials have not increased we have seen a substantial increase in the number of people reserving grave spaces. It is always a tremendous privilege to be trusted to speak with people who are making arrangements for their funeral and I am pleased that after dealing with so many funeral arrangements I am able to offer support as well as practical suggestions.

This year we have seen our new glades really start to take shape with the grass growing well and the thinned trees starting to make real

growth. This summer has been quite dry in the woodland but our trees have thrived in the warm summer days and I am delighted that our visitors are so complimentary when they visit. I have to say a huge 'thank you' to Will Saunders who takes care of the maintenance of our woodland. He is so professional and competent with decades knowledge of land management, but we all know how careful and conscientious he is in looking after our glades and managing the woodland.

I would like to also express my thanks to the team of volunteers who spent the day in the woodland recently caring for the graves. Over ten tons of soil and many more of compost were moved to prepare and seed graves. This was a labour of love so please do support us in ensuring that everybody keeps to the rules of the woodland as set out by the Trustees. Our vision is that the woodland remains as natural as possible and we do not want to look like a commercial cemetery. It is really important that we do not have separate planting on graves and we need to make it as easy as possible for Mr Saunders to mow the area to keep the glades looking cared for.

This will be in keeping with the ethos and vision of the Woodland Burial Ground and maintain our environmentally friendly standards. to their loved ones as they return their remains to the earth in a natural way.

What a lovely day we had celebrating mums life at Woodland Burial Trust, Keysoe. That may sound a strange thing to say, given her death had been such a shock to my family, but it absolutely was. I knew nothing about the Burial Trust until I read of it in her will and subsequently went into panic. I felt out of my comfort zone at a time when family was counting on me to make the arrangements. Thank goodness for Linda, she waited patiently whilst I got



lost, explained what the options were and gave me sound wisdom about what has worked for others, given my inexperience of organising a funeral. Having a small ceremony was the right thing to do as it allowed for tears and sadness to flow as Linda read some moving passages, that none of my family would have managed. It was so dignified and truly calm. The plot is marked with a simple wooden plaque, under a tree, where the gentle breeze whistles through the leaves, giving this place a strong sense of life and energy. The most amazing thing was how Linda completely put herself out and arranged at very short notice to host the ceremony on a Sunday to tie in with my family's travelling arrangements.
